This makes the magic happen. Partnerships with a Chabad House include three components:

- 1. While purchasing and sponsoring mitzvos and kiddushim, events and classes feels like you are connecting to Hashem, there are regular costs to maintaining a shul. These expenses are not glamorous but they are the foundation of a Shul's budget.
- 2. The amount of work involved in all the operations requires copious manpower hours. Volunteers who take complete ownership for certain tasks in a Shul also become the life-blood of the organization.
- 3. The growth of any organization depends on the culture environment that one experience on a visit or during regular attendance. When the environment is warm and welcoming, and many people greet you on each visit, inviting you into their lives and working to find ways to make your life better, that org. becomes your home.

So, to those who consider ChabadCLE, a.k.a, the Waxman Chabad Center to be their main shul, or those who consider Rabbi Chaikin or myself as their primary rabbi, we ask for a full partnership: \$1000 + 25 hrs of work in the Shul.


Looking forward to a year of revealed good and growth b'Gashmius u'Bruchnius, both physically and spiritually.

Enclosed, please find the High Holy Days schedule, including times for candlelighting and prayer services. Also included are procedures for the many holiday customs. Page numbers for the prayers refer to the Lubavitch Tehillas Hashem Siddur – Annotated Edition. You will also find the form for the Pidyon to the Rebbe's Ohel to be sent before Rosh Hashana.

The Rebbe established a special Tzedakah fund, "Keren Hashana" at Lubavitch World Headquarters. This fund disburses Tzedakah to charitable causes, every single day of the year, on behalf of all those who contribute to the Keren Hashana fund. In this way, the Rebbe explained, each participant has the merit of giving Tzedakah every single day of the year.

The number of days in the upcoming year is 355. Accordingly, your contribution to Keren Hashana should be in the amounts of 355 (dollars, quarters, dimes, etc.) for each member of your family. The Rebbe would speak every year about the importance of this fund and encouraged everyone to participate. A return envelope is provided for your convenience.

The Rebbe also urged everyone to contribute to a "Simchas Yom Tov" fund before each holiday. This fund provides assistance to numerous families, enabling them to enjoy Yom Tov in full measure. A return envelope is also provided.

The Rebbe's Message

To the Sons and Daughters of our People Israel, Everywhere, G-d bless you! Greeting and Abundant Blessing: These are the days of preparation for the New Year, may it bring us and all our people Israel good and blessing. If our Torah, Torat Chayim (the Law of Life), is in every respect the teacher and guide of the Jew, it is surely of special importance to seek its guidance in preparing ourselves for the new year, a year which we pray and hope will begin a new and much better life; better in every respect. The weekly portion of the Torah relating to these days is Nitzavim - "You stand firmly This Day," which "is always read before Rosh Hashanah, as also indicated by the word Hayom ('this Day'), referring to Rosh Hashanah." It begins with a timely instruction: You stand firmly this day, all of you, before G-d, your G-d. Jews must stand firm and unshakable, though they are "the smallest among all the nations." This can be, only when they are bound and united together - "all of you." How is it possible to form a true and enduring union of different individuals, with different ideas, different interests and different aspirations? The answer is, "Before G-d, your G-d." The union of all Jews is possible because, as a matter of fact, they are already united by virtue of their souls, the Divine soul, which is "verily a part of G-d above," and which is found in every Jew without exception. And the profound reflection that one stands "Before G-d," Who is "Your G-d" - your strength and your life - must bring forth and actualize the union of one Jew with another, and of the individual with the community of our people, in the fullest measure. But what is the purpose and end of this union? This, too, is explained in the Torah in the immediately following verses: "So that you may enter into a covenant with G-d, in fulfillment of His oaths a covenant with G-d, your G-d, renews this day, a covenant designed "to raise you up this day as a people unto Him," a nation consecrated to G-d, a nation which consecrates the everyday life down to the last detail, to conform to G-d's Torah and to the fulfillment of all His commands. May G-d grant that the preparation for the New Year as indicated above be carried out by every Jew and Jewess, in the best way and in the fullest measure, and may the new year be a good and sweet year, materially and spiritually.
