



TISHREI WITH THE REBBE- IN CLEVELAND?

Many of us remember spending Tishrei in Crown Heights. Accommodations were often sketchy. Basement beds alongside family storage, basement aromas, and one time, pipes dripping on my pillow. Schlepping small children on long car rides, keeping them up late to join the Hakhel dancing in the streets. Knowing in advance that coming home with colds is expected.

So, what did we get out of it? On Rosh Hashana, I saw the Rebbe cover stacks of packages of letters with his Tallis, as he prayed for the writers, and, I imagine, for all of K'lal Yisroel. On Yom Kippur, who can forget the sight of the joyous dancing to Napoleon's niggun after the shofar blast. During Succos, a Tzivos Hashem rally for the children, downstairs in 770, with the Rebbe up close. On Hashana Rabba, women waited in line to bentch the Rebbe's lulay. All visitors waited in line by the Rebbe's succah to get honey cake and a brocha for a sweet new year. The Rebbe often gave a Sicha on Chol H'moed between Mincha and Maariy, and, the highlight, Simchas Torah, watching the Rebbe dance with his brother-in-law, and waiting for Kos Shel Brocha hours after Haydalah.

So, Tishrei in Cleveland. Where's the excitement? This year we had a good taste of the inspiration the Rebbe still continues to provide through his shluchim and all their hard work, and through all of us who are connected, Baruch HaShem.

A week before Rosh Hashana, the women and girls had an exciting Hakhel event. A large gathering at Yavneh was taught and led in zmiros from Slichos and Tehillim by Rochel Covitch and her back up group of vocalists and musicians. Between songs, we were introduced to the idea of Hakhel, along with suggestions on how to create our own Hakhel events by Rivky Friedman. The men enjoyed a similar evening, singing and farbrenging with Rabbi Shmuli and Avi Lampert. That same busy weekend, there was a story time event for children led by Raizel Neiman and Rivky Friedman.

Just before Rosh Hashana we had a meaningful Shabbaton with Rabbi Manis Friedman, enjoying his wise words on enhancing relationships with our spouses, our friends, and our children. Elegant, delicious, and thought provoking, we were joined by many friends who are not regulars at Chabad. That Motzei Shabbos, Rabbi Manis spoke to teens, encouraging them to see their essential value to the world, followed by a concert.

The davening on Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur was expertly led by Rabbi Shmuli and many others. B'H, we have a deep bench of Chazzanim. A highlight of Succos, along with the beautiful weather, was the family festival on the first day of Chol H'moed. First a children's carnival, complete with a climbing wall, bungee cords, and bouncy houses. Then a delicious barbecue followed by dancing to the Rogers Park band. Shimini Atzeres and Simchas Torah, highlights of any Tishrei, were no exception this year. Lovely buffets both nights, and a lunch by day, followed by spirited dancing joined by many community members. What a way to end a month of serious introspection, physical affliction, memories of those we've lost, and intense prayer for a healthy meaningful year ahead, by celebrating the Torah that guides our lives.

Rabbi Chaikin mentioned that those of us who've seen the Rebbe should share what we've seen. I was in Crown Heights for the last Simchas Torah before gimmel Tammuz. Somehow, I managed to score a perch atop a bench in the section closest to the Rebbe's balcony for the seventh Hakofah. The Rebbe was holding a small Sefer Torah on his lap, and his hand was under the mantle of the Sefer Torah, in what I can only describe as a caress. It felt like a moment of such intimacy, that I felt like an intruder to be watching, but I knew it was a moment I would revisit forever. And so I have.

Thank you to the Rabbis, Rebbitzens, and all the volunteers who worked hard to make this Tishrei one to remember. May we all use the inspiration we gained to keep us going, b'Simchah and b'Tov L'vov throughout the year.
