#### **Lubavitcher Rebbe assumes leadership (1951)**


At a gathering of Chassidim marking the first anniversary of the passing of the sixth Lubavitcher Rebbe, the late Rebbe's son-in-law, Rabbi Menachem Mendel Schneerson, delivered a Chassidic discourse (maamar) entitled <u>Basi LeGani</u> ("I Came into My Garden"), signifying his formal acceptance of the leadership of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement.

### OUR CHILDREN; 🕅

The WCC Shabbos Children's program offers many different services. Our Shul-goers, shul children, and guests have benefit in many ways. Children have a game room and space to play downstairs. Together, they daven and are taught about Parsha and Yomim Tovim, in a fun and interactive way. The Kids' Kiddush is a weekly highlight where they receive snacks and drinks while learning to make brachos and bentch.

For over a year now, Morah Raizel Neiman, an experienced teacher together with teens Lottie Ginsburg, Tzophia Frances and Chana Neiman give of their time every Shabbos morning. This is to ensure that participants in our Shul can daven knowing that the children are being lovingly cared for. The children are taught how to enter shul quietly as they go sit with their parents, to participate in shul for the taking out of the Torah and for Kedusha. (This takes practice.) They earn shul tickets throughout, which can then be redeemed for prizes monthly or can be saved up for bigger prizes!

The Sunday before Rosh Chodesh, the children gather for their own Hakhel Rally and educational program at Shul run by Morah Raizel. A music program for Elul, a craft for Tishrei, rainbow fruit for Cheshvan, scratch art for Kislev as they learned that a little light pushes away a lot of darkness, and for Shevat will feature a Tu B'Shevat Jeopardy game as well as a 3D tree craft with flowers for Yud Shevat, portraying Basi L'Gani!

Parents are welcome to join the programs or daven upstairs, have a direct communication Children Program WhatsApp, and warm friendship with the people running the programs.

Just as each individual letter in the Torah is unique and important, each child in our shul is also! In Parshas Yisro this month, we learn that the children were chosen as our guarantors for receiving the precious Torah.

Please join the effort of investing in the our future, the children, ensuring that each child can receive Torah guidance, feel welcome in the fulfillment of its mitzvos, in coming to shul and learning how to participate.

"HAKHEL ES HA'AM - GATHER THE NATION: THE MEN, THE WOMEN & THE CHILDREN

#### **HAKHEL GATHERINGS**

### Who should arrange these gatherings?

Hakhel is clearly no regular mivtza. Unlike other mivtzoim, like mivtza tefillin, which entail encouraging a single person to do a mitzva, the focus of hakhel is to arrange communal gatherings and influence many people at a time. It can feel intimidating to get involved in these activities. 'I'm not a leader, I'm not an activist, I'm not a rabbi, I'm not a mashpia.' It's so easy to feel like mivtza hakhel is out of your league.

The Rebbe acknowledged this feeling, 'Every person is a leader on some level,' the Rebbe said, 'and can influence people. **Gatherings should therefore be arranged by everyone, men, women and children.** The king was the one who would gather the Jewish people, and every person is a "king" and a leader in his own way.

"This is within the capability of every single man and woman," the Rebbe said. "...[There are] those that think they are only "small people" and can't really do much. [However, this mindset is wrong,] only the world's concealment of holiness can bring someone to think this way! The truth of the matter is that every person was given the highest and most amazing capabilities!"

Reach out to everyone you know: family, friends, acquaintances, neighbors, business associates, classmates, and on and on - and bring them together for a hakhel gathering.

Children should make gatherings for their friends.

This is especially incumbent on the "kings," a person with status in his circle—a rov in his community, an educator in his classroom, and a father in his family.

### Where should they be held?

In a "Beis Hamikdash"—in an atmosphere of holiness. Even better if it is done in a physically holy place, like a shul, beis midrash, etc. The main point is to arrange it in the right time and setting so that the influence and inspiration will be at its fullest.

The hakhel gatherings should also be done virtually— over the telephone and the like—in order to reach all Jews no matter how far they are.
